The European Commission's Directorate-General for Internal Market, Industry, Entrepreneurship and SMEs (DG GROW) is happy to share with you the latest news on events, projects and calls in the area of tourism.

Creation of a new informal Commission expert group

The Commission has created the informal **'Together for EU Tourism (T4T)' expert group**, following an open <u>call for applications</u> for individuals and organisations.

The group is composed of a maximum of 50 different stakeholders and individual experts, as well as Member States' authorities and public entities.

The experts will work in **three sub-groups** on the **green** transition, **digital** transition and **resilience/ inclusion/ skills,** and will follow-up and monitor the actions in the <u>Transition Pathway for Tourism</u> and the <u>EU Agenda for</u> <u>Tourism 2030</u>.

They will act as a bridge between the European Commission and the broader T4T stakeholder community and support making the <u>collaborative IT platform 'T4T'</u> an effective community space for all stakeholders from 2024 onwards.

The first meeting took place on 22 June 2023 and we look forward to working with its members closely over the coming months and years.

Guide on EU funding & open calls

The <u>Guide on EU funding for tourism</u> is regularly updated with relevant open calls for tenders and proposals under the section "Open tourism calls". Current funding opportunities include, for example:

 a call for tenders on "Supporting Sustainability and Resilience of EU Tourism Destinations" to offer technical assistance to tourism destinations, published on 17 May. The new call deadline is <u>27 June</u> <u>2023</u>. More information here: <u>eTendering - Data (europa.eu)</u>;



- several cascading calls for proposals to directly support SMEs across EU countries, e.g. <u>ACCELERATOR</u> call for supporting SMEs in the tourism sector (closes on 4 July);
- o announcement of 4 <u>forthcoming calls under Horizon Europe</u> with potential to support tourism;

• <u>open calls under Erasmus+</u>, some of those focusing on vocational education and training and others to support mobility of staff to undertake a learning/professional experience in another country, closing on different dates in October 2023.

On 31 May, a 2nd call for proposals was opened under the European Urban Initiative. The call will fund projects to deliver tangible, real-life examples under three topics, one of them <u>"Sustainable tourism"</u>. Under this topic, projects will be funded to support the long-term green and digital transformation and resilience of the tourism ecosystem. By introducing unique solutions and comprehensive policies for the promotion and management of sustainable tourism, cities can set an example for smaller towns, villages and regions that are more dependent on tourism for their economy, particularly in terms of reducing overdependence on a single sector and combining tourism economic activities with other investments and job creation efforts for diversification to other sectors. The other two topics are "*Greening cities*" and "*Harnessing talent in shrinking cities*".

An indicative budget of EUR 120 million of the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) is allocated to this call. Each project can receive up to EUR 5 million ERDF co-financing, and project implementation should take place within a maximum period of 3,5 years. The call is open until 5 October 2023. Selected projects will be announced in May 2024.

Urban authorities can apply to the call. More information on the specificities of eligible authorities can be found on page 13 of the <u>EUI-IA Guidance</u>.

The objective of the **Code of Conduct for online reviews and rating for tourism accommodation** is to define best practices to ensure that the reviews and ratings are reliable in this specific sector. Progress of the Transition Pathway for Tourism: Stocktaking 2023

All stakeholders who have submitted pledges to the <u>Transition Pathway for Tourism</u> have been asked for an update on the progress of these pledges. This update provides us with key information on active pledges and

their progress, which feeds into the first stocktaking report of the Transition Pathway, to be published before the end of the year. We encourage you to send in your updates, as those pledges from which we do not receive information will be assessed as "non-active/need revision". The Commission has launched a **public consultation** to gather people's views **on the EU's intermediary climate target for 2040**, setting a path from our already-agreed 2030 targets to net-zero emissions by 2050. The European Commission would like to <u>hear your views</u> on the draft delegated regulation on European Sustainability Reporting Standards (ESRS). These standards guide companies in their reporting as required by the <u>Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive</u>. The feedback period is open until **7 July 2023**.

Relevant publications

A <u>package of different documents on sustainable finance</u> was published by the European Commission on 13 June 2023. The aim of this package is to ensure that the EU sustainable finance framework continues to support companies and the financial sector, while encouraging the private funding of transition projects and technologies. Specifically, the Commission added additional activities to the <u>EU Taxonomy</u>, including accommodation in <u>Annex IV of the EU Taxonomy Delegated Act</u> on restoration of biodiversity and ecosystems. The EU Taxonomy is a classification system that helps companies and investors identify "environmentally sustainable" economic activities to make sustainable investment decisions.
